

If you wish to have a quilt entry judged, please indicate this on your Registration Form and include \$5.00 per registration of the item you wish to have judged. We also need you to attend the quilt show!! If you missed the 2016 quilt show, then you really need to come see this one!

2018 Quilt Show Guidelines

Quilt Show Rules

- 1. Anyone entering an item must be an active member of the TQG and have participated in a majority of the construction of the item entered.
- 2. No entries that were previously shown in a TQG show are allowed.
- 3. Each entrant may enter 3 pieces total. There is no entry fee to just show a quilt, but if you chose to both show and have your quilt judged, there is a \$5.00 registration fee. This is noted on the registration form. *Only one entry per category will be judged*.
- 4. All quilts entered must consist of 3 layers, meaning a top, middle filler and back (except for "Wool" quilts which will be in a separate category). Each entry must have a 4" sleeve and a sewn cloth label with your name, TQG #, city and state. The label should be sewn on the bottom right-hand quarter of the quilt. Clothing labels should be sewn inside the garment but in such a place where it can be located easily.
- 5. All entries must be clean, undamaged and free of smoke or other odors and pet hair.
- 6. All show entries must remain on display for the entire show. No entry will be released from the show prior to 5 pm the last day of the show. An individual receipt must be presented for each item picked up.
- 7. Awards will be given at the discretion of the judge based on NQA standards. All decisions of the Quilt Show committee and show judges are final. All award categories do not have to be conferred.
- 8. It is the entrant's responsibility to choose the category for entry. A quilt entered in an incorrect category will be evaluated by the judge but will be ineligible for placement awards.

- 9. The Quilt Show committee reserves the right to combine categories or move entries between categories.
- 10. False Backs Cloth quilts with false backs (quilts not quilted or where the back obscures the quilting) will not be eligible for awards. Linings are allowed on wearables and are not considered false backs.

Clarifying Terms

Individual – Quilts where 1 person has completed all of the work on the quilt, including piecing/appliqué, quilting (hand or machine) and binding.

Collaborative – Quilts where 2 or more people collaborated on the completed quilt (ex. quilted and/or bound by someone other than the individual).

Innovative – Quilts that display a deviation from traditional technique in shape, design, line, use of color, embellishment, imagery, etc.

Thread Art – The predominant technique used to achieve the desired effect in an original design through the use of thread applied by machine.

Wearables- Must be a garment intended for wear including ensembles, jackets, skirts, etc. Accessories (coordinating hats, purses, etc.) may be entered as part of an ensemble.

<u>Exhibits</u> - Items that need to be placed together such as round-robins, pizza box exchanges, bee challenges, theme displays, etc. Judging will take place before submissions are hung, so quilts designated to be judged may be a part of an exhibit. Each exhibit should be given a common name on the registration form. For instance, a pizza box exchange should be given a name to identify that particular exchange and the name would be used on the registration form to ensure the quilts will be placed together.

<u>Miscellaneous</u> – Other quilted items such as accessories, hats, purses, table runners, tree skirts, toys, etc. These items should be registered under *EXHIBITS* with the word *MISCELLANEOUS*. *They* will not be judged.

<u>Special Exhibits</u> - Exhibits such as Linus Quilts, Quilts of Valor, Memory Quilts, etc. They are for display only, not judged.

Quilt Show Categories

Hand Quilted - Applique

Applique makes up 80% of the quilt top and the quilt layers are joined without the use of a machine in any way.

Small - 55" or less on shortest side

Large - more than 70" on shortest side

Machine Quilted - Applique

Applique makes up 80% of the quilt top and the quilt layers are joined using a machine.

Small - 55" or less on shortest side

Large - more than 70" on shortest side

Hand Quilted - Pieced

Piecing makes up 80% of the quilt top and the quilt layers are joined without the use of a machine.

Small - 55" or less on shortest side

Large - more than 70" on shortest side

Machine Quilted - Pieced

Piecing makes up 80% of the quilt top and the quilt layers are joined using a machine.

Small -55" or less on shortest side

Medium – 56" – 70" on shortest side

Large – more than 70" on shortest side

Machine Embroidery Any Size

All designs are embroidered and embellished by your machine.

Hand Embroidery Any Size

All designs are embroidered and embellished by hand (Example: Red Work, Blue Work, etc).

Miniature

All aspects of the quilt are reduced in scale using any technique. May be hand or machine quilted. If blocks are used, they should be no larger than 4" square. Mini whole cloth

quilts should be entered in this category. Quilts must measure less than or equal to 24" on each side. A single full-scale quilt block, layered and quilted, is NOT a representation of a miniature quilt.

Mixed Technique

A combination of two or more techniques and when the entry does not fall into one of the other categories.

Innovative/Art Quilts

A quilt of *original design* that uses techniques to show originality in theory, design, color or technique.

Other/Specialty Quilts Any Size

A single technique is used to develop the design of the top; e.g. whole cloth, yo-yos, surface design, crazy quilt, cathedral windows, puff quilt, tied quilt.

Wearables

Fashionable and wearable garments, such as vests, jackets, skirts, dresses, etc.; using any technique.

Wool Quilt Any size

A bed/lap size quilt or wall quilt that is made predominantly from 100% worsted wool using any technique. Wool quilts may or may not have batting or other material used between the top and back of the quilt.

The TQG 2018 Quilt Show Committee is looking for "junior quilters" to enter one or more of their guilt creations into the guilt show for a Special Junior Quilters Exhibit! They would have to have done, at least, 50% of the making of the guilt in order to enter their item. If you, a TQG member, are fortunate to know or have a junior quilter in your midst then you may register their guilt under your name to have it exhibited. This WILL NOT count against your quota of 3 entries for the quilt show. Simply complete the Registration Form and indicate in Category #1000 Exhibit - "Junior Quilter" with their name, relationship to you, age, and city/state. The quilt will need a hanging sleeve and a label just like all of the other exhibited guilts. What a treat it would be to display these wonderful quilts and to have the "Junior Quilters" come to the show to see their quilt hanging

Lynne Wilder is certified by the American Quilter's Society as a textile appraiser

and is a former member of the Executive Board of the Professional Association of

Appraisers-Quilted Textiles (PAAQT). A retired senior executive in the federal

government, she holds a Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Maryland, and a Master of Sciences degree from George Mason University in Northern Virginia.

A quilter for over 18 years, Lynne is well-versed in most aspects of quilting. She is skilled in hand piecing, applique, and quilting; machine piecing, applique, and quilting--both on domestic and long-arm sewing machines--and machine embroidery. Her education and expertise in these areas directly benefit her ability to assess the value of contemporary and antique quilts. Lynne maintains an extensive personal

reference library of quilting techniques, fabric dating, quilt designs/patterns, fabric designs, and quilt history in the United States.

Lynne has completed the instructional courses and rigorous certification testing on Insurance, Market, and Donation appraisals taught by American Quilter's Society appraiser certification program. She participates in continuing education classes and lectures pertaining to appraising, conservation, preservation, quilt history, and dating of textiles and successfully completed the USPAP (Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practices) course on personal property appraisals. Lynne is an active

member of the American Quilter's Society, American Quilt Study Group, ColonialPiecemakers Quilt Guild, and Professional Association of Appraisers-Quilted Textiles. She participates in quilt history study groups in three states. Lynne appraises quilts at both local and national shows, and volunteered in the multi-year Baltimore Applique Society-sponsored documentation project of the Maryland Historical Society Museum's

extensive quilt collection and with the Virginia Quilt Documentation Project. Shecurrently volunteers in the Colonial Williamsburg Museums' Textile Storage and Conservation Lab.

Lynne lives in Williamsburg, Virginia, with her husband Bill and dog Molly. She's the proud mother of two daughters and grandmother to two grandsons.

Appraisal Appointments: We are taking appointments for appraisals with Lynne Wilder. Contact Jane Ann Snyder at janesnyder@aol.com or phone her at (757) 434-3610. We will also have the sign-up appointment list at the Saturday, Day & Night Chapter meetings for your convenience. Written appraisals are \$65.00 and oral appraisals are \$30.00 (cash or check) paid directly to Lynne Wilder at the time of the appointment. Written appraisals can be for antique, vintage or ne quilts—to include quilts hanging in the show or brought in for appraisal. Appraisals take approximately 30 minutes. Written appraisals are typed and include a photo of the quilt and are then mailed to the quilt owner in approximately 2 weeks. Oral appraisals are for antique or vintage quilts only. Appraisals take about 30 minutes per quilt.

WHY APPRAISE?

- To establish a replacement value for insurance purposes before a loss (stolen, lost, destroyed or damaged)
- To meet insurance company requirements for a "Fine Arts Floater" including transit and display
- To establish value for donation, gift, or estate purposes as required by the IRS
- To obtain a descriptive written record for the family
- To mail your quilt and/or meet requirements for entrance in a textile competition
- To determine Fair market value for the sale of quilts
- To accompany a quilt to be given as a gift.


HANGING SLEEVE INSTRUCTIONS

EXHIBITING YOUR ENTRIES. A few reminders regarding your entries.

All quilts (wool quilts are exempt) must contain a filler (batting or fabric) sandwiched between two (2) layers of fabric which are joined with quilting. They may be either hand or machine quilted. Each quilt (miniature quilts are exempt) must have a hanging sleeve 4" - 5" wide when finished and sewn securely to the quilt. If the quilt has no hanging sleeve, it will not be displayed. Below are the instructions to make a hanging sleeve:

Out a strip of fabric 9 inches by the width of the quilt.

NOTE: If you need to piece multiple strips for the length, finish the inside edge by zigzaging or making a French seam.



Hint: Use a whip-stitch on both top and bottom to securely attach the sleeve to the quilt being sure that your stitches catch both the backing and batting but don't show through on the front.
