If you recently joined and did not get a TQG pin, please see me at the night membership table or Ann Walls at the day or Saturday chapter to get your pin. Sorry about that.

#### Night Chapter Program

The night guild program will be a demonstration on how to assemble a thread catcher. If you would like to try to make one too, you will need the following supplies and preparation:

- 1 4" embroidery ring- we will only use the inside ring
- 1 fat quarter
- 1 scrap of batting, minimum 4" square
- 1 piece of cardboard, minimum 4" x 8"

Hand sewing kit - needle, neutral or matching thread, scissors, other scissors to cut cardboard The card board should be thicker than the board that comes in pantyhose packages, but not as thick as a corrugated cardboard box. If you can't find any, I will have some extra.

Before guild night, you will need to cut a section from the fat quarter 11" x 14".

Sew the long sides, right sides together with a 1/2" seam to create a tube.

Press the seam open. Turn over 1/4" to 1/2" on each end of the tube to the wrong side, and press. Bring the tube and remainder of the fabric with you. You should be able to finish the project at the meeting.

Hats off to Wilma Gerald for arranging the trunk shows at the March Day and Night Chapter meetings by Swirly Girls Design. Susan Emory showed some beautiful quilts and gave us insight into the design process she uses to construct her quilts.

I have already had two people inquire about signing up for Charlotte Angotti's workshop in August. Registration will begin May 1. Look for the registration form in next month's newsletter and on our web site.

**JUNE 2014.** Sue Reich will present two trunk shows and presentations on WWI and WWII quilts. This is the centennial year for WWI quilts so it is a timely presentation. We were hoping to have an after school workshop following the Day Chapter but she has to be in Texas on Thursday.

AUGUST 2014. Charlotte Angotti is returning to conduct a Saturday workshop (August 9) and presentations to both the Day and Night Chapters. She owned a quilt shop in this area several years ago. Please schedule your vacation around this workshop and save your pennies. The workshop is called "Let Me Surprise You." She will provide a laser cut kit for the participants; so, there will be no pre-cutting/preparation for the workshop—just bring basic sewing supplies. I hear it is very popular at the Houston show and sells out fast. That's the good news; the bad news is that the kit costs \$95 and is due at the time of registration. I thought long and hard about offering this class but when looking at the cost of fabric and in my own case, I sometimes spend more than I would have if I had just gotten the kits. Charlotte can't give us dimensions because it is all a surprise but tells me that her patterns are easily enlarged if you want a different size. There are samples on her web site of previous class projects. Her presentations are: Night Chapter, "Why Aren't You Making More Quilts? I know you have the fabric."; Day Chapter: "Surprise Yourself! The book, the quilts and all the fun of the method." <u>http://www.quiltmakersstudio.com/</u>

**NOVEMBER 2014.** Sara Bliss Wright will be making PowerPoint presentations to the Day and Night Chapter. She is not a quilter but has thoroughly researched quilts and quilting. There are many positions on our executive board and at our chapter meetings that need to be filled.


I hope you are thinking of where you can help out next year. Please, really consider this. The guild doesn't run on its own.
