




August Program:

Dorothy Bangert, a local women, has made a quilt that is currently housed in the Smithsonian Museum.



She called it "October Fury." Her presentation is entitled "They Did Their Duty & Kept the Peace." She retells the story of the Cuban Missile Crisis that occurred 60 years ago. Her husband was on the USS Blandy when it was off of Cuba and poised to fire a nuclear missile at them. Through a great deal of research she has corresponded with the Captain of the Soviet Foxtrot submarine that was also off of the coast of Cuba who had orders to fire at the United States at will with his nuclear missile. Her story, as told in part through the voice of her now deceased husband, stresses the significance of just how close we came to a nuclear war. Her quilt embodies the lessons learned from the "incident."



Several of you asked us to run another workshop after seeing the first group's beautiful creations and so Charlotte has kindly agreed to offer a second workshop on Saturday September 11.



VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

I joined the Guild in 2015 (I know, that still makes me a newcomer to some of you!) just about the time that Lisa Freiman wanted to move from her position as Executive Librarian for the Guild. I volunteered. I've had that job and Day Chapter librarian since that time, and before we begin in-person meetings again (hooray!), I'd like to thank my chapter librarians.

Thanks to the Saturday Guild librarian, Rachel Parker. She had the job for three years, taking over from Christina Hunt and before that, Christie Prenger, who moved from there to Program Coordinator. Elizabeth Peake assisted for some time. Before that, Saturday Chapter didn't have its own library access. Rachel liked the job but won't be able to continue this year.

Night chapter: longest tenure during my time was Betsy Powell. She took excellent care of the position for a few years, letting it go only when her move to a much smaller place made it necessary. Before that, Ann Brothers was librarian for some years. Thanks to both, and to their assistants. The last year before the whole shut-down I acted as Night chapter librarian.

Day Chapter has had one librarian since I began: that's me. Shelley Steward acted as assistant librarian for four years, allowing both of us to move around other tables. Thanks to Shelley, and to Mary Hormel, longtime coordinator of book sales for our shows!

Many thanks to all these volunteers, and to all of you who've had the job in years past.

Here's the deal: I enjoy being a Chapter librarian, and I think I have some more to do as Guild Executive Librarian. I hope to keep it up for some time

yet. I like going to Day and Night, but I can't do Saturday too. I like the option to go to extra meetings but don't like being required to go. I'm storing four collections right now, including the one that doesn't rotate, and storage is getting expensive.

CHAPTER LIBRARIANS ARE

NEEDED. All three Chapters can use a main person and an assistant/partner. Requirements: getting there for every meeting, a vehicle that can handle five milk crates and a folding cart, a back and arms that can sling a milk crate, and storage space (not more than ten cubic feet). Also, an interest in the collection and willingness to help people find the topics or titles they're interested in. A good clear voice and acute hearing also help, as our meeting rooms get noisy!

Each Chapter collection has a set of cards, one for each book, for recording checkouts. The notebook has procedures and library information, a full listing of the whole library collection by title and author, a description of the Subject Heading numbers and a listing by subject number. A page having contact information for all the other librarians helps too. We have our own carts, bigger and more maneuverable than the Guild's other flat carts. Best of all, for all you book lovers: FIVE HUNDRED or so books to browse through, a new 150 every four months, and YOU DON'T HAVE TO KEEP THEM!!!

We begin meetings in person in September, and I'd like to have each Chapter outfitted with collection and librarian, from the beginning. I'll be there at the first meeting for any new librarian. If you're interested, email me, Laura Storm, bookpush-er55@gmail.com. Let's talk.



Rules:

The quilt show is open to amateurs, professionals and seniors. Entry fee is \$5 per class.

Each quilt should have a 4" sleeve (for hanging purposes) sewn onto the back side of the quilt as close to the top edge as possible, before they are delivered to the Fair. Please sew the sleeve on top and bottom of the sleeve. ****QUILTS WILL NOT BE DISPLAYED WITHOUT A SLEEVE.**

For fairness in judging, please stitch a piece of fabric covering the name of the competitor before delivering the quilt to the Fair.

- All quilts must be clean, free of smoke or odor, constructed of fabric and quilted.
- All entries must have been completed within 3 years of the Fair entered and have never competed at a State Fair.
- There is a limit of one quilt per person, per class. A quilt may be entered in only one class.
- Quilts that do not meet these requirements will not be judged or displayed. These competitors will be notified. Entries submitted in the wrong category will be evaluated and displayed, but will not receive an award.
- **Please include quilt dimensions** in description field of entry form.
- Special 1st, 2nd and 3rd placing for longarm quilter across classes 3, 5-17. Please include individual name or company when entering to be included in competition.


