## BLOOM

Pat Carney
"Bloom" is a turned-edge appliqué project that finishes as a 21 " square block that makes a cheery pillow or wall hanging. The pattern is from Tilda called "Hometown Put Down Roots." It is simplified in the sample.

I will be teaching a freezer paper and starch method for the turned-edge applique.
Various appliqué techniques can be used to sew down the appliqué (even by machine). I will demonstrate several of those methods.

We will not be using machines in this class.

# Blue Onion Challenge Workshop

This class is for the person who wants to learn a good technique for consistent curves, and who brings a dedication for precision and organization. The unique cutting directions for this quilt require a Creative Grids ruler. I encourage you to look at it. It has several pretty patterns that you can make with it, should you decide to buy the ruler. It is a requirement for the class, as well as the Blue Onion pattern.

If you are looking for a fast, easy, one-day project, then this is NOT the class for you. Also, this is not a beginner friendly class. It is challenging and different!

This is a machine class and perfect for beginning, intermediate, and advanced quilters.


## Curvalicious

Curvalicious is an original pattern of an Interleave quilt offered either in 2inch strips or 1-inch strips. Interleave quilts are accomplished by shifting fabrics. Now is your chance to be a shape shifter.

The quilt top finishes at approximately $60 \times 60$.
Your homework prior to class is to choose your fabrics and cut your strips. According to the directions.

Once you arrive to class, I will show you how to line up your fabrics and sew a quilt top in a day.


## Dresden Circles



This fun quilt can be easily adjusted to whatever size you would like it to be.
The placement of the Dresden Plates is entirely up to you and you can have as many or as few as you would like - with the simple technique you will learn in class your Dresden Plates are guaranteed to be flat.

## Description:

Great for your Orphan Blocks! Learn how to make padded handles with attached hardware, work with foam interfacing, and make French seams. You can make any size. The pictured bag is $13^{\prime} \mathrm{H}$ $\times 10$ "(front panel) $\times 9$ " W (side panel).

You could use a couple of orphan blocks, piece new blocks prior to class, or just use a fabric you love without piecing. The key to the success of this bag is foam interfacing. I use Annie's Soft and Stable, but you can use other foam products if you desire. Note that during class we will not be piecing the blocks for front and back. The photograph is just a sample.

## Size:

This tote will be quilted before assembling. The size of your tote will be determined by the size of your 2 primary front and back blocks, whether pieced or plain. I suggest $10.5^{\prime \prime}$ to $12.5^{\prime \prime}$ square (or rectangular) to begin, but it's up to you to start with whatever size you want. The two side panels can be the same size or a couple of inches narrower, but they need to be the same height as your blocks. You will be adding a 2.5 " strip of contrasting fabric to the top of each of the 4 pieces before quilting. Check out your leftover Jelly Roll strips for a scrappy look.

There will be 4 panels, and 4 side seams. The tote bottom will be decided according to your block size. You will be quilting 5 outer panels with your lining "backing" fabric. Note that there is a little shrinkage depending on your quilting density, so you will be trimming the edges after quilting.

It's best to do some preparations before class. Supply list will be sent after you sign up. Please indicate whether you want to pay Mary $\$ 5$ for a kit of 4 metal rectangle hardware and webbing so she can order.
