

Day Chapter

Hello Day Chapter,

Here are a few quilting quotes you might enjoy.

“A good day is a day spent quilting.” “Quilts are like friends, a great source of comfort.” “I will not buy any more fabric until I use up the stash I have at home,” I said. And then I laughed and laughed! Have you ever been with a few quilting friends and realized the conversation has been all about quilting? Our hobby has unlimited opportunities for learning and experiencing new challenges.

At our November 14th meeting **Lola McCracken** will talk about her time living among the Kuna indigenous people on the islands off the Caribbean coast of Panama and the Kuna's original art, **the Mola**. The women sit in the shade of palm trees and work their magic with hand stitching reverse appliqué. Lola will bring Molas for your inspection as well as quilts made from the Molas. For those who have heard her talk previously, there will be new information.



The program was presented by **Deborah Schupp** which could have been called “Gumbo Quilting.” Deborah presented a fascinating program of how her Louisiana (where they did not quilt at all due to the climate) youth influenced her nonconventional quilting designs. Her quilts were so creative and she provided humor noting the reaction of the conventional quilters. Her creativity inspired us all to try new things.



Our October meeting was also charged with excitement as there were 69 in attendance. Sixteen of those were on Zoom and we had 5 guests. It's

hard to believe it's been 4 years since the last Quilt Show, and so many have been working to make it successful. **Debbie Coleman** encouraged members to submit quilts for the show, and can decide whether or not to have them judged. As the deadline for submission has passed, hopefully many will be available to hang. That being said, many volunteers are critically needed to help hang and prepare the site, so please contact Debbie for that and/or to assist during the show. The guild librarian, **Laura Storm** will be at the Quilt show with books you can purchase.

It's almost time to draw for two raffle quilts! **Susan Newsome** and **Millie Johnson** are selling, and you have another chance to buy tickets in November. The ticket sales from these beautiful quilts help provide speakers and education for the members. Come to our November meeting to get more chances! **Karen Levine** announced that on October 22nd, she will be at Woodlawn Funeral Home from 10am to 3pm to work on **Linus Quilts**. You just need to bring a sewing machine. Treasurer, **Millie Johnson**, reported a balance of \$940.64 as of October 9. **Betsy Kessler** reported that TQG entries did well at the State Fair. There were 35 quilted and 6 non-quilted submitted with 16 ribbons awarded. The quilts were presented and each of them was spectacular. **Norene Skiles** will be recordings of quilters talking about their quilts for a project called “Go Tell It at the Quilt Show”. The purpose is to document the various stories behind the making and memories of quilts. Contact Norene for more information.

Since there were only 4 blocks returned **Joyce Guster** said the drawing will be delayed until November's meeting. Block of the month: **Susan Newsom** showed the free pattern for a leaf design which is available on the website. Batiks are encouraged. leaf-themed Block of the Month pattern. Dig through your scraps and whip up some of these quick and easy blocks to turn in at the next meeting. You might win them all!






Optical Illusions in Quilts presented by Norene Skiles. Come explore transparency, 3D designs, pixelations, and stripes.





Volunteer to help at the show





Of course, it's much too big for the crates that come to the meetings, so this book stays in the Green collection, the one that can only be browsed online or in the librarian's notebooks. But it can be borrowed – along with the other too-big or too-small items, the DVDs, the old and fragile things – you need only request it.

It's **The Quilts of Gee's Bend**, by William Arnett and others, Green 65, the exhibition catalog that described the travelling exhibit that came through the Chrysler Museum about twenty years ago. With all the full-page color photos, there are biographical sketches with photos of some of the makers of the quilts, a bit of history of Gee's Bend, essays from curators and art historians – and did I mention the full-page color photos?


