

While you are thinking about the State Fair also remember it is the Guild Quilt Show next year - one quilt can be entered in both events as there is plenty of time between the two shows.



- (445) Applique/Sequin Pins in either ½" or ¾" in length

October Meeting Minutes.

Lynn Valos opened the meeting for **Chapter Coordinator Lola McCracken**. Calling the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m., she welcomed our visitors and invited them to introduce themselves.

Drawing – A drawing was held for those members who completed the first half of the 40th anniversary wall hanging. **Martha Phibbs** was the lucky winner.

Raffle Quilt- **Pat Carney** reminded everyone that the drawing for the Raffle Quilt will take place at the Day Chapter Meeting in November.

Spring Fling – **Pat Carney** also told us that we have lost the venue we had for Spring Fling. We are looking for another venue, and we hope to be able to hold it March 21 or March 28, 2020.

Patterns – **Ann Lockler** and **Sara Crusier** would like members to buy a pattern or bring one in to donate. If you make the pattern that you buy, you will be eligible to win a prize.

Speaker – **Linda Reynolds** introduced **Mark Sherman**, our speaker, who told about his development as a quilter from his sewing lessons from his mother to his achievement as a National Winner and judge in National Competitions. He displayed many of his beautiful quilts and talked about their history and the special techniques he used to complete them.

Phyllis Hatcher – will present a lecture and trunk show Saturday, December 7 during the Saturday Chapter meeting quilts, but a fee will be assessed and an appointment must be set up in advance.

Library Challenge – This will run from May-November. “Quilting is a Chal-

lenge”, a quilt that is designed and completed after the designer was inspired by a book in our library. For the Library Challenge, the **minimum** size for the quilt is 36” x 45.

Next month (November) will be the cutoff for showing quilts in the challenge.

We now have the Red Collection.

Treasurer – **Mary Hormell** said we have \$130.05 in our treasury. The amount will increase with the additional startup funds from the Guild.

Lucky Buck – **Joyce Guster** won 13 blocks.

Strips & Fat Quarters – Strips and fat quarters were put on hold for a while since participation is down, and **Joyce Guster** will be working with **Gene Ann Hall** in the Lucky Buck program.

Magazines – We could use more magazines.


Show & Tell – We concluded with an outstanding Show & Tell.

Gadget Guru

Hello fellow quilters I feel quite badly for being MIA for months but there is a reason. I had not found any new gadgets for you until now. I have found that elusive gadget, but first I have to ask you a question. How many times has your bobbin gone missing from your spool of thread? Well this gadget solves the problem. It is called "Bobbin Link". It come in pack of ten. There is a blue cap to which a cable is attached. The cap goes over the bobbin and spool and the cord goes up and around the spool and into a groove in the cap. Small bead on the ends of the cord hold it in place.

TQG 2019 Library Challenge

The TQG Library has about 700 books free to guild members. We want you to look through the books and find a quilt just for you. Rules to enter:

A **completed quilt** of a minimum size with the pattern or inspiration taken from a guild library book.

Minimum size: 1620 square inches. Example: this could be a quilt 36" x 45". There is no maximum size limit.

Technique and method: Any **finished quilt** that has a top, batting, backing, quilting and binding/knife edge is allowable.

All quilts must be completed and shown at a Chapter Show and Tell by November 2019. The name of the library book must be mentioned. Quilts may be shown as they are completed (July meeting, September meeting, etc.). Upon being shown, the quilter's name will be entered in that Chapter meeting's drawing pool. There will be one name drawn for a prize at each (Day, Night, Saturday) December 2019 Chapter meeting. You do not have to be present to win. Guild members may only enter one quilt for the TQG Library Challenge. The quilt may be shown at all meetings but will be entered for a prize at only the first meeting at which it is




