


appear here and on the website. She also

Tidewater Quilter's Executive Board Meeting Minutes

Date: July 11, 2019

Call to order: Meeting called to order at 6:30PM by Debby Coleman, President.

Secretary: Motion to approve minutes as circulated made by Karan Fisher. Motion seconded by Linda Reynolds. Motion voted upon and passed.

President: Debby Coleman announced that the recent TQG Symposium was very successful. Anniversary pins are still available at the cost of \$5.00.

Debby reported that the next Sew Day for VB Strong Quilts would be on July 17. Nineteen quilts are needed and will be presented to the families and victims during the holiday season. Norene Skiles has volunteered to make a different themed quilt for the shooter's family.

First Vice-President: Pat Carney explained the duties of the Vice President. The Library Challenge and Spring Fling were discussed. Volunteer teachers are needed for Spring Fling.

Second Vice-President: Linda Reynolds discussed her duty of obtaining national speakers for guild programs. A proposal for Phyllis Hatcher, quilt appraiser, to present a program and then appraisals for a \$50 fee discussed. Motion made by Sybil Magrill and seconded by Wendy Barrett for approval of this program. Motion voted upon and passed. Members reminded that Mark Sherman would be doing a program on October 13, 2019.

Treasurer Report: Proposed budget discussed by Lenore Mastroianni, Treasurer. Quilt Show expenses amended to \$1400. Motion to approve budget made by Pat Carney and seconded by Debi Harding. Motion voted upon and passed. Lenore requested each chapter submit to her their ending balance.

Membership Chairman: Linda Kelley announced the guild currently has 360 members. Members were reminded that it is time to renew their memberships.

Raffle Quilt: Raffle Quilt Report has been submitted (attached) and was discussed.

Properties Chairman: Debi Harding announced that the fee for the storage shed has been paid through 8/6/2020. Debi requested that members notify her if they have a key to the shed. Requests for meeting dates at the church need to be submitted to Debi.

Library Chairman: Laura Storm made the motion to purchase two new carts at the cost of \$80 - \$100 to transport the books to chapter meetings. Motion seconded by Lisa Freeman. Motion voted upon and passed. The Library Challenge was also discussed.

Day Chapter: Lola McCracken introduced Day Chapter's new board members.

Night Chapter: Lisa Frieman introduced Night Chapter's new board members.

Saturday Chapter: Christie Prenger introduced new Saturday board members.

Virginia Quilt Museum: It was announced that the museum is considering doing a temporary exhibit at Chrysler Hall.

Old Business: None.

New Business: State Fair submissions discussed. Betsy Kessler will be coordinating and transporting member's quilts to the State Fair. Mileage reimbursement for transporting the quilts was discussed. Motion made by Sybil Magrill that a \$50 mileage reimbursement be made for transportation of the quilts to the fair. Motion seconded by Christy Prenger. Motion voted upon and passed.

Adjournment: A social hour followed the meeting adjournment at 7:45PM

- **Quilts picked up from Betsy— by appoint after October 9th or at the Day or Night Guild Meetings, October 14th.**



TQG 2019 Library Challenge

The TQG Library has about 700 books free to guild members. We want you to look through the books and find a quilt just for you.

Rules to enter:

A completed quilt of a minimum size with the pattern or inspiration taken from a guild library book.

Minimum size: 1620 square inches. Example: this could be a quilt 36" x 45". There is no maximum size limit.

Technique and method: Any **finished quilt** that has a top, batting, backing, quilting and binding/knife edge is allowable.

A Library book may be checked out any month starting in May 2019 and will be extended up to 3 months check-out for those using the book for the challenge.

All quilts must be completed and shown at a Chapter Show and Tell by November 2019. The name of the library book must be mentioned. Quilts may be shown as they are completed (July meeting, September meeting, etc.). Upon being shown, the quilter's name will be entered in that Chapter meeting's drawing pool. There will be one name drawn for a prize at each (Day, Night, Saturday) December 2019 Chapter meeting. You do not have to be present to win. Guild members may only enter one quilt for the TQG Library Challenge. The quilt may be shown at all meetings but will be entered for a prize at only the first meeting at which it is shown.

Darlene Price filled in for Millie Johnson to collect and sell raffle quilt tickets.


Rachel Parker continued to speak about Library Challenge. Due date for projects is November 2019 meetings.

Basic Sewing Supplies

- Cutting Mat, Ruler (6" x 24", 6" x 6"), and a rotary cutter with a sharp blade.
- Sewing machine in good working order, power cord, foot pedal, sharp needle, piecing thread that blends with your fabric. Optional, but helpful – ¼" seam guide.
- Notions:
 - Pins, minimal pinning is required.
 - Fabric marking tools – Frixion or heat removed NOT recommended. I used Crayola fine tip washable markers. Mechanical Chalk pencils also work well.
 - Starch
 - Scissors, thread snips, seam ripper, stiletto.

3 Quart size bags.

Optional: small design board, or scrap batting about 14" x 14".

Pattern – Parts 1-3 provided at class.


