This unique quilt will be easy to make, with a little know-how on nesting seams and making fun curves, which I will show you. It's a variation of the Drunkard's Path block. You need to bring your squares into class with them already lined up: Print, background, print, background, etc. That is our starting point! Leave the additional background fabric/squares aside. We'll be making the quilt top in class. To finish the quilt you will need binding, backing and batting.

Understanding Color in Quilts

Deciding which colors to use is an important part of planning a quilt and one that many quilters find frustrating and potentially disappointing. The purpose of this workshop is to expand the participants' knowledge of color and how to use it effectively in quilt making.

We will discuss the elements of color relevant to quilt design, how to choose and develop a color scheme, practice using Joen Wolfrom's Ultimate 3-in-1 Color Tool to identify the color families in fabric and identify guidelines for using color to achieve the ultimate goal of color harmony in your quilts.

Please bring any fabrics you would like help in identifying their color family, prints you would like advice on choosing an appropriate color scheme, and quilts that you feel have color issues for which you would like help identifying solutions.

Pop Art Pups Collage Pillow

In this class we will learn Emily Taylor's method of parchment paper collage to build a beautiful dog to place on fabric for a wall hanging or pillow. After the collage is finished and placed on background fabric, simple thread painting secures everything. Instructions will be given to complete your pillow at home.

I will have a variety of dog-colored fabrics for you to supplement your own fabrics.

I will also have a kit for \$10. The kit includes: a package of Steam a Seam 2 lite, parchment paper, a felt

covered foam board and pins needed for Emily Taylor's method.

We should be able to complete the collage in class and instructions will be given to make your pillow at home. If you bring your backing fabric to class, you can place your collage on the pillow and iron in place. Thread painting will be done on your own.

Supply list:

Pattern: go to Collagequilter.com to purchase downloadable pup pattern. Search for pup and you can choose from 9 dog patterns for \$12 or all 9 in one download for \$29.

A variety of fabric scrap pieces in colors you want for your pup. Look at her samples online. A variety of small to medium tone and scale prints work best.

Iron, a mini iron works best

Fabric scissors, small Karen K Buckley scissors are best

Youth Sewing Class - Animal Tote Bag

We will provide fabric for the animal blocks, but you will need fabric for the outside and inside of the tote bag. Animal choices: dog, cat, fish.

I will provide a variety of threads, a couple of templates and a zipper jig for you to try. You will need to know basic sewing.
